

Early Impact Virginia offers a comprehensive professional development program for family support professionals with online, asynchronous and synchronous trainings offered in locations across Virginia and through Zoom. EIV recommends that all FSPs take the Pre-Assessment on the Institute to assess their current knowledge. After taking the Pre-Assessment, the Career Compass maps the pre-assessment results into a transcript of skills showing competency attainment and gaps. FSPs can choose their individual learning pathway to fill their competency gaps.

The charts below contain a recommended training progression of competency areas to focus on in the first 12 months of hire. Supervisors can use this progression with family support professionals to plan professional development activities.
